Many lessons in *From Adam to Us* have a corresponding map in this book. At the end of each lesson with map assignments, you will be instructed to find a certain map in this book and complete the assignments for that lesson.

You should use colored pencils to complete each assignment. Regular crayons will be too thick. During the course, you will need each of these colors:

red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple, pink, black, gray, and brown
We highly recommend a quality colored pencil brand like Prismacolor®.

When you are coloring in a shape, color neatly and completely; solidly but not too hard. When you circle one or more words, make your circles (or ovals) neat and complete. When you are instructed to trace along a line, trace just beside the line so that the color will be visible. Do your best and neatest work so that you will be pleased with your collection of maps!

Map 6 - Shang Dynasty

Lesson 17

1. The Shang Dynasty developed along the Yellow River. Trace along the Yellow River with yellow.
2. The longest river in China is the Yangtze. Trace along the Yangtze River with blue.
3. The source of both the Yangtze and Yellow Rivers is in the Tibetan Plateau. Circle the words "Tibetan Plateau" with orange.
4. The mouth of the Yellow River is the Bo Hai Gulf. Color the Bo Hai Gulf pink.
5. The Bo Hai Gulf is an arm of the Yellow Sea. Circle the words "Yellow Sea" with yellow.
6. The Yellow River winds through the Ordos Desert. Circle the words "Ordos Desert" with brown.
7. The last capital of the Shang Dynasty was Yin. Color the building representing Yin red.
8. The area inside the dotted line represents the land controlled by the Shang Dynasty. Color this area orange.

Map 7 - Egypt, Libya, and the Hittite Kingdom

Lesson 19

1. The Hittite kingdom was Egypt's main rival during the early years of Ramses II. Shade behind the words "Hittite Kingdom" with brown.
2. The Egyptian and Hittite armies met in battle at Kadesh in 1275 BC. Underline the word "Kadesh" in blue.
3. The Egyptian army defeated Libya when it tried to take over the Nile Delta region. Shade behind the word "Libya" with orange.
4. The Temple of Seti I is located at Abydos. Underline the word "Abydos" with purple.
5. Ramses II built a temple to the god Amun at Karnak. Underline the word "Karnak" with green.
6. Ramses II built a funeral temple for his father at Thebes. Underline the word "Thebes" with black.
7. Ramses II built two temples at Abu Simbel that are carved into a cliff. Underline the words "Abu Simbel" with gray.
8. Abu Simbel is in the Nubia region in southern Egypt. Shade behind the word "Nubia" with pink.

Map 34 - Russia of Peter the Great

Lesson 112

1. During the "Time of Troubles," Russia fought a long war with Poland. Circle the word "Poland" with orange.
2. Peter the Great enlarged Russia's territory. Color the territory of Russia under Peter the Great gray.
3. In 1695 Peter the Great led his army against the Ottoman Empire. Draw an arrow from the Russian territory toward the Ottoman Empire with green.
4. Peter the Great led the Russians in capturing the port city of Azov on the Sea of Azov from the Ottomans. Draw a box around the word "Azov" with red. Color the Sea of Azov blue.
5. The Sea of Azov empties into the Black Sea. Draw an arrow from the Sea of Azov into the Black Sea with black.
6. In 1700, Russia entered an alliance with nearby European countries against Sweden. Shade behind the word "Sweden" with yellow.
7. In the Great Northern War, Russia gained ports on the Baltic Sea. Color the Baltic Sea pink.
8. In 1722-23, Russian forces captured territory from Persia along the Caspian Sea. Color the Caspian Sea brown.
9. Peter the Great founded the city of St. Petersburg in 1703. Draw a tiny palace above the words "St. Petersburg" with purple.
